The prayer in the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for the quashing of order dated 07.04.2022 passed by the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Amritsar (Annexure P-3) vide which the petitioner has been declared a proclaimed person in a complaint bearing No.NACT No.496 dated 19.01.2019 under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881.

When this matter came up for hearing on 01.06.2022, the following order was passed:-

“The learned Senior counsel for the petitioner submits that the proper procedure under Section 82 Cr.P.C. has not been followed while declaring the petitioner a proclaimed person and he is ready and willing to join the proceedings immediately.

Notice of motion for 27.07.2022.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to appear before the learned Trial Court within a period of 03 days from today and on his appearance he shall be admitted to regular bail to its satisfaction”.

The learned Senior counsel for the petitioner while referring to the Zimni order dated 18.07.2022 submits that the petitioner has since been admitted to bail. The aforesaid order is taken on record as Mark ‘A’.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court. Disposed of.

It is expected that the petitioner shall henceforth not absent himself from the Trial except for sufficient cause.
