[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P-1, dated 22.07.2019, in CWP No.781 of 2017 as also on account of intentional and willful breach of undertaking furnished before this Court vide affidavit Annexure P-2 dated 22.05.2019.

[2] A perusal of order Annexure P-1 reveals that CWP No.781 of 2017 was disposed of in terms of the additional affidavit filed on behalf of Assistant Director (S.A-2), Office of Director Public Instruction (S.E), Punjab regularizing the services of the petitioner dated 13.06.2019 on the conditions as mentioned in the said order.

[3] Learned counsel contends that pursuant to the filing of the instant petition, the respondents have released financial benefits to the petitioner as per entitlement in terms of order of regularization, Annexure P-5, therefore, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same while granting liberty to the petitioner to seek interest

on account of delayed release of payment by way of appropriate proceedings in accordance with law.

[4] In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
