The petitioner while invoking the inherent jurisdiction under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure prays for issuance of a direction to conduct the fair and impartial investigation after registration of a criminal case on the basis of complaint dated 21.07.2021.

The petitioner claims that accused persons have cheated him of Rs.35 lakhs.

On reading of the petition, it is evident that there were various business transactions between the petitioner and the accused. If the police has not taken any action, the petitioner has a remedy of filing criminal case before the Illaqa Magistrate.

Hence, no ground for exercise jurisdiction under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is made out.
