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**AMOL RATTAN SINGH, J. (Oral)**

By this petition, the petitioners seek quashing of FIR No.15, dated 23.01.2015, registered at Police Station Sadar Ludhiana, District Ludhiana, alleging therein the commission of the offences punishable under Sections 457, 380, 447, 506, 511 and 120-B of the IPC, as also all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom including the final report (Annexure P-2), on the basis of a compromise, arrived at between the petitioners and respondents no.2 and 3.

Pursuant to the order of this Court dated 04.07.2022, the report of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Ist Class, Ludhiana, dated 26.07.2022, has been received, stating to the effect that the complainant in the FIR, i.e. Sukhdev Kaur was reported to have died and her son had executed a power of attorney in favour of one Jasvir Singh, who appeared before that Court and placed on record the instrument conferring such power on him. He also

stated that the matter has been compromised between Jagjit Singh, i.e. son of the complainant as also his brother on the one hand and the accused persons, i.e. petitioners herein on the other, with his statement also supported by learned counsel for the complainant.

Similar statements in respect of the compromise entered into between the parties are also stated to have been recorded by the four petitioners herein. The Investigating Officer also appeared and stated that another accused, i.e Malkit Singh has died.

As per the assessment of the learned Magistrate, the compromise seems to have been arrived at between the parties voluntarily, without any undue influence, pressure or coercion.

Learned counsel appearing for respondents No.2 and 3, i.e. sons of the complainant today also admits to the factum of the compromise reached between the parties.

That being so, looking at the nature of the offences alleged to have been committed by the petitioners, and the fact that the matter has been compromised between the petitioners and respondents No.2 and 3, the present petition is allowed and FIR No.15, dated 23.01.2015, registered at Police Station Sadar Ludhiana, District Ludhiana, alleging therein the commission of the offences punishable under Sections 457, 380, 447, 506, 511 and 120-B of the IPC, along with all proceedings emanating therefrom, is hereby quashed.
