By way of the present petition, the petitioner seeks directions to the official respondents to register an FIR against the private respondents and to take action against them in accordance with law.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that though the petitioner has already submitted a representation to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Amritsar, Rural, for redressal of his grievance, yet the same has yielded no result. It is further submitted that the conduct of the proceedings at the end of the police authorities clearly shows them being hand in gloves with the culprits. The petitioners are aggrieved against the inaction on the part of the police authorities.

I have heard the learned counsel for the petitioner.

The petitioner is aggrieved against the inaction on the part of the police authorities. In view of the judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Sakiri Vasu** Vs. **State of U.P. and others**, (2008) 2 SCC 409, and **M. Subramaniam and another** Vs. **S. Janaki and another**, 2020(2) RCR (Criminal) 788, in case of non registration of an FIR, the

remedy of the aggrieved person is not to approach this Court, but s/he is at liberty to approach the Magistrate concerned under Section 156(3) Cr.P.C.

In view of the above, the present petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to avail his remedy in terms of the aforesaid judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court.
