KARAMJIT SINGH, J.

The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in case having FIR No. 116 dated 09.09.2021, registered under Section 306 read with Section 34 IPC at Police Station Sadar Sangrur, District Sangrur.

The counsel for the petitioner has argued that sister of the petitioner got married with deceased Maghar Singh. It is further argued that said Maghar Singh was never harassed by the petitioner or his sister. The counsel for the petitioner further argued that Maghar Singh committed suicide by consuming poisonous substance on 06.09.2021 and that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case by simply alleging that he, his sister and parents used to harass deceased Maghar Singh. The counsel for the petitioner further argued that there is no suicide note which was left behind by the deceased. He further argued that the petitioner has joined the investigation in the light of the previous order dated 14.06.2022 passed by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court.

The State counsel on instructions from ASI Pushpinder Singh has not refuted the fact that the petitioner has joined the investigation and that the petitioner was brother in law of the deceased who committed suicide but no suicide note was recovered. The State counsel further submits that on completion of investigation the police has presented the challan and that now the petitioner is not required by the police for further investigation or custodial interrogation.

In view of the above, as the petitioner has joined the investigation, no useful purpose is going to be served even if the petitioner is subjected to custodial interrogation, at this stage. Thus, without commenting on the merits of the case present petition is allowed and order of interim bail dated 14.06.2022 is hereby made absolute, subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
