1. This order shall decide COCP-1672-2020 and COCP-48, 49, 62, 68, 69, 70, 188, 189, 190, 191, 366, 741, 744, 851, 855 and 914 of 2021 as prayer in all the petitions for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of identical order Annexure P/1 dated 2.11.2018, in XOBJ-142-CI-2011 in RFA-2753-2006, RFA-1195-2004, XOBJ-133-CI-2011 in RFA-2747-2006, RFA-33-2016, RFA-4115-2003, RFA-4113-2003, XOBJR-116-CI-2018 in RFA-3707-1998, RFA-2105-1996, XOBJR-136-CI-2018 in RFA-2112-2017, XOBJR-119-CI-2019 in RFA-978-1997, RFA-2104-1996, RFA-2126-1996, RFA-3673-1998, XOBJ-129-CI-2018 in RFA-516-2003, RFA-3111-2016, XOBJR-59-CI-2018 in RFA-2497-2015 and RFA-7057-2015.

2. With the consent of learned counsel for the parties, facts of the case are being taken from COCP-1672-2020.

3. A perusal of order Annexure P/1 dated 2.11.2018 reveals that XOBJ-142-CI-2011 in RFA-2753-2006 were allowed and the respondents were directed to release payment to the land owners-petitioners on account of compulsory acquisition of their land.

4. Learned counsel contends that the instant petitions were filed on account of failure of the respondents to do the needful.

5. Learned AAG, Punjab has produced copy of order signed by Sh.Ravi Kumar, Executive Engineer, Project & R.M. Division, RSD-Shahpurkandi Township mentioning that sanction has been received in the petitioners' cases (17 cases), details of which are given in the said order, by the competent authority and the same are under process in the office of the Financial Advisor & Chief Accounts Officer, RSD-Shahpurkandi Township for release of payment to the Land Acquisition Collector, RSD-Shahpurkandi Township and further disbursement to the petitioners, for which some time be granted. The said communication is taken on record. A copy thereof has been supplied to learned counsel for the petitioners, who states that in the circumstances, the petitioners are not interested in pursuing the contempt petitions and the same may be disposed of by directing the respondents to release payment to the petitioners in terms of their entitlement in XOBJ-142-CI-2011 in RFA-2753-2006, RFA-1195-2004, XOBJ-133-CI-2011 in RFA-2747-2006, RFA-33-2016, RFA-4115-2003, RFA-4113-2003, XOBJR-116-CI-2018 in RFA-3707-1998, RFA-2105-1996, XOBJR-136-CI-2018 in RFA-2112-2017, XOBJR-119-CI-2019 in RFA-978-1997, RFA-2104-1996, RFA-2126-1996, RFA-3673-1998, XOBJ-129-CI-2018 in RFA-516-2003, RFA-3111-2016, XOBJR-59-CI-2018 in RFA-2497-2015 and RFA-7057-2015 in a time bound manner.

6. In the light of the position noted above as well as statement

of learned counsel for the parties, the instant petitions are disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 while directing the respondents to release the payment to the petitioners in terms of their entitlement as mentioned above within six weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

- 7. Rule discharged.
- 8. Needless to mention, in case the needful is not done within the stipulated period of time, the petitioners would be at liberty to move applications for revival of the instant petitions and in the eventuality of filing of such applications, strict view would be taken in the matter.
