CRM-M-29909-2021

By this petition, the petitioners seek quashing of FIR No.63, dated 12.05.2021, registered at Police Station Noorpur Bedi, District Rupnagar, alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under the provisions of Sections 447/511/506/148/149 the IPC, as also all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of a compromise (copy Annexure P-2), arrived at between the petitioners and respondent no.2.

Pursuant to the order of this court dated, 01.11.2021, the reports of the learned JMIC, Sri Anandpur Sahib, dated 04.01.2022 and 12.10.2021, have been received.

As per the first report, the petitioners as also respondent no.2 appeared before that court, with respondent no.2 having stated that he had compromised the matter with the petitioners of his own free will and he has no objection to the FIR being quashed.

That court has further stated that as per the report of the Ahlmad of the court, there was no other person aggrieved of the matter, other than the complainant in the FIR.

The learned JMIC has also opined that the compromise entered into between the parties appeared to be of their own free will.

Subsequently, in the report dated 04.01.2022, it has been stated that on 15.12.2021 again, the complainant, i.e. Jiwan Kumar, appeared before that court and stated that though he had got the FIR registered against the petitioners and other six unknown persons, he has no objection if the FIR is quashed against all persons.

Learned counsel appearing for respondent no.2 reiterates the aforesaid.

That being so, without making any comment on the actual merits of the case, since the matter is shown to be have been compromised between the parties voluntarily, the petition is allowed and FIR No.63, dated 12.05.2021, registered at Police Station Noorpur Bedi, District Rupnagar, alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under the provisions of Sections 447/511/506/148/149 the IPC, along with all proceedings emanating

therefrom, is hereby quashed.

In view of the fact that the FIR itself has been quashed, this petition, by which the petitioner sought to be admitted to 'anticipatory bail', has been rendered infructuous and is disposed of as such.
