[1] Prayer in the instant petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 06.02.2019 in CWP No. 15922 of 2017 in case titled as Sanjiv Kumar and others vs. State of Punjab and others.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 reveals that CWP No.15922 of 2017 was disposed of on the instruction of the learned State counsel that the Secretary Education, Punjab would consider the matter in the light of orders dated 30.10.2018 and 13.09.2018 within six weeks and take necessary steps and in case any adverse decision was to be taken, the same would be conveyed to the petitioners forthwith.

[3] At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioners states that pursuant to order, Annexure P/1 dated 06.02.2019, the respondents have passed order dated 02.08.2019 accepting the claim of petitioner Nos.5 and 6 while rejecting the claim of other petitioners and that in the circumstances, the petitioners do not wish to pursue the instant petition

and may be permitted to withdraw the same with liberty to challenge order dated 02.08.2019 to the extent it rejects the claim of petitioners Nos.1 to 4, 7 and 8 by way of appropriate proceedings in accordance with law.

[4] In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioners, the contempt petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 while granting liberty to the petitioners as prayed for.
