ARVIND SINGH SANGWAN J. (Oral)

The primary ground taken in all these petitions is that the respondent/wife and her father are practicing Lawyers in Karnal and therefore, Mr. Veerbhan Bhatti, counsel representing the petitioner/husband is always under pressure either by the respondent side or by the members of the Bar that he should not represent the petitioner in these proceedings.

During the course of arguments, it is mutually settled between the parties that all the cases, which are pending at Karnal will be listed on one date so as to enable the petitioner/husband to appear only on one date in one calendar month in all the cases.

Counsel for the petitioner has shown some apprehension that the petitioner is also facing some sort of threat, accordingly, it is directed that on the date when the cases are fixed for hearing, the Superintendent of Police, Karnal will depute two police constables for the protection of the petitioner as well as learned counsel representing the petitioner during the Court proceedings so that no untoward incident take place.

Since the counsel for the respondent has no such objection to the said arrangement, these petitions are disposed of in the following terms:-

(a) The Principal Judge, Family Court, Karnal will take up both the petitions filed under Sections 9 and 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, respectively on the same date and the Civil Judge, with whom the suit for permanent injunction is pending will also grant the same date so as to enable the petitioner/husband to appear on one day in one calendar month.

(b) On the date when the case is fixed, the Superintendent of Police, Karnal/the SHO of the concerned Police Station will depute two police constables, who will assist the petitioner as well as the learned counsel representing him during the course of day in the Court during the Court proceedings.

(c) The Principal Judge, Family Court, concerned is directed to make all endeavour to dispose of both the petitions filed under Sections 9 and 13 of the

Hindu Marriage Act, at the earliest, in accordance with law.

With the aforesaid observations, all these petitions are disposed of.
