The matter was called twice but nobody has caused appearance on behalf of the petitioner.

The present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India with a prayer to issue a writ in the nature of Habeas Corpus for appointment of a Warrant officer with a roving writ to release the cousin and few other friends of the petitioner as mentioned in para No.2 of the petition.

Since the learned counsel for the petitioner has not appeared despite matter was called two times, this Court would therefore proceed with this case on the basis of the averments made in the petition, the report of the Warrant Officer and with the assistance of the learned Deputy Advocate General, Punjab.

The allegations in the petitions were that 4 boys who have been described in para No.2 of the petition have been illegally detained at Police Station City Sunam, District Sangrur and therefore, this Court on 19.07.2022 issued notice of motion and appointed a Warrant Officer.

The report of the Warrant Officer has been received by this Court in sealed cover which has been perused. As per the report of the Warrant Officer alongwith the petitioner searched the hawalat and other rooms of the Police Post Joi, City Sunam, District Sangrur but the alleged detenues were not found there and thereafter, they also searched the parking area of the aforesaid police post wherein the petitioner had intimated that two motorcycles without any number plates were parked belong to their friends. The matter was discussed with the Sub Inspector (Incharge) and she stated that they had neither arrested the alleged detenues nor registered any case against them. Thereafter, the aforesaid Sub Inspector alongwith her staff reached at the site and the owners of the vehicles as well as any other person were not present there. The statement of the petitioner was also recorded by the police wherein he has stated that he does not want to go any other place in this regard.

In view of the above, no person was found detained in the police station. Therefore, no further action is required in the present petition which is seeking a writ in the nature of Habeas Corpus since nobody has been found detained in the police station or any other place.

Consequently, the present petition is dismissed.
