Complaining wilful violation of the directions issued in CRM-M-30780-2019 decided on 22.07.2019, the petitioner has filed the present petition under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971. The operative part of the order dated 22.07.2019 reads as under:-

“Heard.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that respondent No.5 had committed fraud of 2,54,00,000 / - and after filing of complaint under Section 138 of Negotiable Instruments Act, he with the help of respondent No.6 intimidated the petitioner and is posing threat to his life and liberty. He is also trying to dispose of the material lying at the spot in order to evade his liability to pay the due amount to petitioner.

Without expressing any opinion on merits, this petition is disposed of with direction to respondent No.3 - Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana to look into the grievance of petitioner regarding threat to his life and liberty, verify the same and take appropriate action in accordance with law.

So far as the matter regarding shifting/ disposing of the material /goods by respondent No.5 is concerned, the petitioner has separate legal remedy in this regard, which he can avail, if so desired. ”

Learned State counsel has stated that the aforesaid matter,

after examination, has been filed under the order dated 30.11.2019.

Hence, no further order is required to be passed.

Disposed of.

All the pending miscellaneous applications, if any, are also disposed of.
