AMARJOT BHATTI J. (ORAL)

The petitioner-Amarjeet Singh has filed the instant petition under Section 482 of Cr.P.C. for quashing the FIR No.172 dated 21.03.2018 registered under Sections 323, 376, 377, 498-A, 511 and 34 of IPC (Section 376, 511 and 34 of IPC were deleted later on) at Police Station Samalkha, District Panipat on the basis of compromise between the parties.

As per the facts of the present FIR a written complaint was received from Seema-complainant against the petitioner-Amarjeet Singh and others that she got married in July 2016 with Amarjeet Singh. Her parents had spent Rs. 5 lacs on marriage. After 3 years of her marriage her husband started beating her for demand of dowry. He

was a drunkard person and all the accused started taunting her and also gave beatings to her. During this period, she had a miscarriage. Her brother in law was keeping bad eye on her. Her husband also misbehaved with her and forced relationship with her in an unnatural way. Her mother expired on 09.10.2017, when she was turned out of the house in September 2017. Ultimately the matter was reported to the police and the present FIR has been registered.

The petitioner filed this petition for the quashing of aforesaid FIR on the basis of compromise. The petitioner and respondent No.2 were directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate for recording their statements on the basis of compromise. The detailed report regarding compromise has been received from the court of Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Samalkha (Panipat) dated 09.08.2022. The statement of complainant-Seema has been recorded, where she confirmed the compromise with the petitioner. She confirmed that this compromise has been effected without any pressure, coercion from any side and she has no objection regarding quashing of FIR.

The petitioner-Amarjeet Singh also confirmed this fact in his separate statement. The statement of SI Yogesh is also recorded who further confirmed that the accused is not involved in any other case nor has been declared as proclaimed offender.

Therefore, from the report of Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Samalkha, it is clear that the compromise has been effected between the parties without any pressure, coercion or undue influence, which is acceptable to both the parties. They have mutually settled all their

disputes. Now they will be able to live peacefully and future litigation will also come to an end. They have already dissolved their marriage under Section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act vide judgment and decree dated 13.07.2022. Therefore, no purpose would be served with the continuation of criminal proceedings.

Therefore considering these fact the petition filed by the petitioner is accepted and the FIR No. 172 dated 21.03.2018 registered under Sections 323, 376, 377, 498-A, 511 and 34 of IPC (Section 376, 511 and 34 of IPC were deleted later on) at Police Section Samalkha, District Panipat and the consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed.

Accordingly, the present petition stands disposed of.
