For the reasons mentioned in the application, the same is allowed and power of attorney filed by learned counsel for respondents No.4 to 6 is taken on record.

The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for short 'the Cr.P.C.') for issuance of directions to respondents No.2 and 3 not to harass and humiliate the petitioner by calling him again and again to the police station without following the procedure prescribed under Section 160 of the Cr.P.C. at the instance of respondents No.4 to 6.

As per the status report filed by way of an affidavit dated 08.03.2021 of Sh.Saurav Jindal, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police,

City-2 Patiala, on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3, during inquiry of the applications filed by both the parties, it has been found that the matter is involved regarding money transaction between the parties and in this regard the parties are directed to pursue their respective case before the Court. Both the parties did not apprehend any breach of peace, therefore, no action is liable to be taken on the application.

In view of the facts mentioned in the above-said status report, no further action is required to be taken in the present petition which is disposed of accordingly.

However, the petitioner is at liberty to avail his appropriate remedies in accordance with law.
