The present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, with a prayer for issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondent Nos.1 to 5, to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of private respondent Nos.6 and 7.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that present petition was filed stating that the private respondents had disputed some claims from the petitioners regarding which they have filed a petition

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under the Minimum Wages Act and thereafter the matter was investigated and inquired into and during investigation it was found thrice by the police that the matter is of civil nature and no offence is made out but the private respondents have been repeatedly filing the applications/complaints before various authorities and now they have filed a complaint before Economic Offences Wing and the Economic Offences Wing, Sirsa vide Annexure P-16, has summoned the petitioners.

Notice of motion was issued in this case and the Registry has reported that respondent Nos.6 and 7 have been served but nobody has caused appearance on their behalf.

Status report has been filed by the Deputy Superintendent of Police, Ellenabad, District Sirsa, on behalf of respondent Nos.1 to 5.

Learned State counsel while referring to the status report filed by the State has submitted that from the inquiry conducted by the police in the complaint/application filed by private respondent No.7, it was found that it was a matter of personal dealings between the complainant party i.e. Private respondent No.7 and present petitioners and a civil suit is already pending between them before the Civil Court and during inquiry the allegations levelled by him against the present petitioners were not established and no cognizable offence was found to have taken place and therefore, the complaint dated 23.7.2021, has been filed.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the specific affidavit filed by the State that the

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complaint filed by the private respondent No.7 has been filed by the police as no cognizable offence has been found to be made out, no further action is required to be taken in present petition and consequently, the present petition is hereby dismissed.
