The petitioner's wife and son have filed a suit for declaration and joint possession with a consequential relief of permanent injunction.

They have questioned the correctness of transfer deed/relinquishment deed executed by Sh. Dalip Singh in favour of defendant no.2 to 5 (his own grand sons). The petitioner is defendant no.7 in the aforesaid suit.

An application filed by the petitioner for transposing him as co-plaintiff has been dismissed by the Court below on the ground that there is common parity between the plaintiff and defendant no.7.

The learned counsel representing the plaintiff claims that he also wishes to challenge the same relinquishment deed. The petitioner does not claim any conflict of interest with his wife and son.

In view thereof, no ground to interfere is made out.

Dismissed.

All the pending miscellaneous applications, if any, are also disposed of.
