The instant writ petition has been filed seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to lift the wheat bags lying in Grain Markets of Faridkot and Sadiq, by contending that the wheat lying in open market areas is being exposed to natural calamities like rainfall, thunderstorms etc.

Pursuant to notice of motion having been issued, reply has been filed by the respondents. As per the reply filed, it is submitted that the wheat stands lifted in May, 2018 itself and as on date, there is no wheat lying in the mandis pertaining to the crop year 2017-18.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the categorical stand taken that as on date, there is no wheat lying in the mandis for the crop year 2017-18, this Court finds that the instant writ petition does not survive.

Consequently, the writ petition stands disposed of as having rendered infructuous.
