The grievance of petitioners herein is that they are not being paid overtime allowance. The petitioners herein are working as drivers and conductors in PRTC and are seeking overtime allowance.

Learned counsel for the respondents would submit that the respondents-Corporation had stopped paying over time allowance with effect from 01.04.2010 till 31.07.2015, however, the drivers and conductors were being given adequate rest in lieu of working overtime. After the financial position of the Corporation improved, the overtime allowance has been paid with effect from 01.08.2015, to all those who are entitled. It is submitted that in connected matter i.e. **Civil Writ Petition No.18652 of 2013**, titled as **Ashok Kumar Sharma and others versus Pepsu Road Transport Corporation and others**, decided on **10.08.2022**, the writ petition stands disposed of giving

liberty to the petitioners therein to file a representation, in case they have any grievance which subsists.

Learned counsel for the petitioners herein does not dispute the disposal of aforesaid writ petition, however, seeks liberty to approach the Labour Court under Section 33(c) of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947.

Consequently, the instant writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioners herein to approach the Labour Court, if they have any grievance, which still survived.
