Complaining wilful violation of the directions issued in CWP No.10323 of 2022, decided on 16.05.2022, the petitioner has filed the present petition under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971. The operative part of the order dated 16.05.2022, reads as under:-

“Petition herein, inter alia, is for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to consider the case of the petitioner for appointment on the post of ‘Staff Nurse’ under BC-B category and to offer him appointment.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner had applied for the post of Staff Nurse under BCB category. He scored 48 marks in the written examination. He submits that petitioner has not been accorded 3 marks qua work experience. Therefore, his name does not figure in the list of selected candidates. Petitioner qua his aforesaid grievance also submitted representation dated 11.04.2022 (Annexure P-16) but the same has not been adverted till date. Hence the petition.

3. On advance service, learned state counsel appears and submits that a decision will be taken by competent authority, either way, on the pending representation dated 11.04.2022 (Annexure P-16) by passing a speaking order.

4. At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner also seeks decision on the pending representation, as suggested by learned State counsel.

5. Given the nature of order being passed, there is no necessity to seek return by any of the respondents as no further proceedings and/or pleadings are required.

6. Without commenting on the merits of the case, the instant writ petition is disposed of with a direction to

the respondents to look into the representation dated 11.04.2022 (Annexure P-16) of the petitioner and pass an administrative order, in accordance with law.

7. Let the needful be done within 30 days from today. 8. Disposed of accordingly.”

On instructions from Sh. Parshu Ram, Superintendent, Confidential Branch, HSSC, Sh. J.S. Pannu, Assistant Advocate General, Haryana, submits that a lot of data is required to be analysed before deciding the representation. He undertakes to complete the same within a period of one month, from today.

In view thereof, no further order is required to be passed.

Disposed of.

All the pending miscellaneous applications, if any, are also disposed of.
