Present application has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C.
for preponing the date of hearing to an early date.

Learned Senior counsel for applicant-respondent No.2 has
submitted that as the present matter has been compromised before the
Mediation & Conciliation Centre of this Court, thus, the date of hearing
of main petition be preponed from 30.09.2022 to an early date.

Learned counsel for the non-applicant/petitioner as well as the learned State counsel have acknowledged the fact that the matter has been compromised between the parties before the Mediation & Conciliation Centre of this Court and have submitted that they have no objection in case the date of hearing of main case is preponed from 30.09.2022 to an early date.

In view of the above statements made by learned counsel for the parties, the present application is allowed and the date of hearing of the main petition is preponed from 30.09.2022 to today itself.

CRM-M-37663-2021

This is a petition filed under Section 482 of Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.14 dated 05.02.2021, registered under Sections 420, 506 and 120-B IPC, at Police Station Division No.2, Pathankot and all the subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

Learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Senior counsel for respondent No.2 have jointly submitted that the present matter has been compromised before the Mediation & Conciliation Centre of this Court and in compliance of the terms of the settlement/agreement executed, the petitioner has handed over a draft of the amount of Rs.23,00,000/-.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that he seeks permission of this Court to withdraw the present petition with liberty to file fresh petition for quashing of the above-said FIR on the basis of compromise.

In view of the statement made by learned counsel for the petitioner, the present petition is dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to file fresh petition for quashing of the present FIR on the basis of the compromise.
