AMARJOT BHATTI J. (ORAL)

The petitioners-Jaspreet Kaur, Bawa Singh and Sandeep Singh have filed the instant petition under Section 482 of Cr.P.C. for quashing the FIR No.81 dated 03.05.2019, registered under Sections 323, 325 and 34 of IPC at Police Station Division 'B' Amritsar, District Amritsar and the consequential proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise between the parties.

As per the facts of the case, the complainant-Vishkaramjot Singh @ Jota gave his statement to the police that on 05.04.2019 at about 8:00 PM, he was returning home from the factory. He stopped in the market to purchase cold drinks from a nearby shop. Bawa Singh

came out and said that he was troubling his daughter-in-law. He put something in his eyes and thereafter gave beatings to him. In the meantime Sandeep Singh (son of Bawa Singh) along with his wife also reached there and threatened to pour acid on him. He caused injuries on his eyes, right cheek, pelvic region and other parts of the body. The accused suspected that he was troubling their daughter-in-law and on that account he was beaten up.

The petitioners filed this petition for the quashing of aforesaid FIR on the basis of compromise. The petitioners and respondent No.2 were directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate for recording their statements on the basis of compromise. The detailed report regarding compromise has been received from the court of Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Amritsar dated 10.11.2022. The statement of complainant-Vishkaramjot Singh @ Jota has been recorded, where he confirmed the compromise with the petitioners. He confirmed that this compromise has been effected without any pressure, coercion from any side and he has no objection regarding quashing of FIR.

The petitioners-Jaspreet Kaur, Bawa Singh and Sandeep Singh also confirmed this fact in their separate statement. The statement of SI Davinder Singh is also recorded who further confirmed that the accused are neither involved in any other case nor have been declared as proclaimed offenders.

Therefore, from the report of Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Amritsar, it is clear that the compromise has been effected between the parties without any pressure, coercion or undue influence, which is

acceptable to both the parties. They have mutually settled all their disputes. They live in the same locality. Now they will be able to live peacefully. It was a case of version and on cross version DDR was recorded. In view of compromise no purpose would be served with the continuation of criminal proceedings.

Therefore considering these facts the petition filed by the petitioners is accepted and the FIR No.81 dated 03.05.2019, registered under Sections 323, 325 and 34 of IPC at Police Station Division 'B' Amritsar, District Amritsar and the consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed.

Accordingly, the present petition stands disposed of.
