1. Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P-1, dated 22.04.2022, in CWP-8219-2022.

2. A perusal of order Annexure P-1 dated 22.04.2022, reveals that CWP-8219-2022, was disposed of by directing respondent No.2 to consider and decide representation dated 06.02.2022, filed by the petitioner, in accordance with law, by passing a reasoned order within four months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

3. Notice has not yet been issued in this case. However, learned counsel for the petitioner at the outset states that he has been furnished copy of order dated 23.05.2022, passed by respondent No.2, rejecting the claim of the petitioner as contained in representation dated 06.02.2022, therefore, in the circumstances, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same with liberty to challenge order dated 23.05.2022, by way of appropriate proceedings, in accordance with law.

4. In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
