[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiation of proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1, dated 07.04.2022 in CWP No.5656 of 2021 in case titled as M/s Tulsi vs. Union of India and others.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 reveals that CWP No.5656 of 2021 was allowed and certificate of registration was directed to be issued in terms of Form No.23-A.

[3] Short reply dated 23.08.2022 along with Annexure R/1 dated 17.08.2022 filed by respondent No.1 is already on record.

[4] Learned counsel for the petitioner by referring to the same states that in view of the needful having been done and certificate of registration required to be issued in terms of Form No.23-A in compliance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 07.04.2022 in CWP No.5656 of 2021 having been issued in respect of the vehicles of the petitioner, the petitioner does not press the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

[5] Accordingly, in the light of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the contempt petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondent No.1 under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
