Status report dated 27.09.2022 with regard to FIR No.15 dated 26.02.2015 under Sections 452, 323, 34 IPC-Cross Version DDR No.33 dated 26.02.2015 under Sections 354-A, 509 IPC, registered at Police Station Badhni Kalan, District Moga, by way of affidavit of Manjit Singh, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Nihal Singh Wala, District Moga, has been filed in Court. The same is taken on record. A copy thereof has been supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for respondent Nos.1 and 2 submits that in view of the status report filed today, he has instructions to submit that petitioner may visit the office of respondent No.2 on any working day during office hours along with a copy of this order, the status report noticed above and other relevant documents, so that the process to issue the passport could be undertaken, in accordance with law.

In view of the above, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that no further orders are required to be passed and the petition be disposed of accordingly by reserving the right of the petitioner to seek revival of the petition in case the passport is not issued to him or for any other reason by virtue of which the cause of action in the present petition would survive.
