The present application has been filed for recalling the order dated 19.05.2022, passed by this Court, vide which order CWP-18484-2017 was dismissed for non-prosecution and thereafter, restoring the said writ petition to its original number.

Notice of the application.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Navdeep Chhabra, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the State and raises no objection, in case prayer of the petitioner made in the present application is allowed and order dated 19.05.2022, passed by this Court in CWP-18484-2017 is recalled and thereafter, the said writ petition restored to its original number.

Keeping in view the above, the present application is allowed and order dated 19.05.2022, passed by this Court in CWP-18484-2017 is recalled and the writ petition is restored to its original number.

CWP-18484-2017:

After arguing for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that as most of the benefits, as claimed by the petitioner in the present petition, have already been released to him by the respondents, but still certain benefits, for which the petitioner is entitled for, remain to be granted to him by the respondents, therefore, the petitioner may kindly be granted liberty to approach the respondent-Registrar, Co-operative Societies, by filing an appropriate representation, claiming the said benefits.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Navdeep Chhabra, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the State and submits that in case any such representation is filed by the petitioner before the respondents, the same will be considered in accordance with law and an appropriate speaking order will be passed by the authorities concerned within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of such representation.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that keeping in view the submissions of learned State counsel, as recorded hereinbefore, no further grievance of the petitioner survives in the present petition at this stage and the same may kindly be disposed of as having been not pressed any further at this stage with the liberty as prayed for.
