Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail in a case FIR No.106 dated 03.07.2021, registered under Section 306 IPC at Police Station Kartarpur, District Jalandhar. The petitioner apprehends her arrest at the hands of Police, in the above FIR.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has invited the attention of the Court to the order dated 24.09.2021, whereby while issuing notice of motion to the respondent-State, the interim protection was extended to the petitioner. The said order reads as under:-

“Learned counsel contends that the petitioner suffered multiple injuries on 01.07.2021, which were caused by Monu and the case FIR No.105 dated 01.07.2021 (Annexure P-4) under Sections 307, 323, 324, 341, 354-A, 354-B, 354-D, 509 and 34 IPC was registered at Police Station Kartarpur, District Jalandhar Rural against him. He submits that two days after the said incident, when the petitioner was admitted in hospital, Monu committed suicide leaving behind a suicide note blaming the petitioner and her relatives. According to him, the petitioner being widow was being forced by the deceased to enter into relationship with him, however, upon her refusal, he caused injuries to the petitioner.

Meanwhile, the petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when called for and in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be admitted to interim bail on her furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner further states that in deference to the said order, the petitioner submitted herself before the Police and joined the investigation. According to him, the petitioner cooperated with the Police Authorities during the investigation and furnished requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer.

Learned State counsel, who is assisted by ASI Kulbir Singh does not dispute this fact that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation for the time being.

Considering above, the petition is allowed and the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 24.09.2021 is made absolute.
