Learned counsel for the parties has moved a joint application i.e. CM-3362-CII-2022, for disposing of the main appeal in terms of the oral settlement arrived at between the appellants-claimants through their counsel and respondent No.3 – Reliance General Insurance Company Limited.

The instant appeal was preferred by the appellants-claimants for enhancement of compensation, which was awarded to them vide impugned award dated 02.11.2010, passed by the learned MACT, Gurgaon. However, during the pendency of the present appeal, the parties amicably settled the matter and arrived at a consensus, whereby, it has been settled that an amount of Rs. 5,00,000/- shall be paid to the appellants/claimants under the head of compensation including interest component, over and above the amount of compensation awarded by the learned Tribunal vide

claim in the present appeal. An affidavit to the said effect has also been filed on behalf of respondent No.3 - Reliance General Insurance Company Limited along with the joint application.

Learned counsel for the appellants/claimants does not dispute the submissions made by the learned counsel for the insurance company with respect to the sum of Rs. 5,00,000/-, which would be paid over and above the awarded amount, as full and final settlement and admits to the compromise effected, as also the acceptance of the same.

In the circumstances, the appeal is hereby disposed of in terms of the compromise effected between the parties, which finds duly detailed in CM-3362-CII-2022 i.e. the joint application filed u/s 151 CPC by the parties. Needless to say that the parties shall remain bound by the terms & conditions of the said compromise.

Respondent No.3 – Reliance General Insurance Company Limited shall deposit the cheque of Rs. 5,00,000/- in the registry of this Court, within four weeks from today, which shall be further released to the appellants/claimants against proper receipt.
