Through this petition, the petitioner seeks regular bail in case bearing FIR No.18 dated 16.01.2021, registered at Police Station B Division, District Amritsar, under Sections 307, 506, 148 and 149 IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Status report dated 14.02.2022, by way of affidavit of the Assistant Commissioner of Police, East Amritsar City, is already on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that as per the case of the prosecution, the petitioner fired a gun-shot at the complainant, but he had ducked and saved his life; that it is a case of no injury; that the petitioner has been in custody since 08.07.2021 and that no recovery has been effected from the petitioner.

On the other hand, learned State counsel submits that the petitioner had fired two gun-shots at the complainant. However, he does not dispute that it is a case of no injury. He also submits that there are 08 more

cases against the petitioner, out of which in some case, he is not on bail.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties and have also gone through the paper-book.

In the present case, the dispute arose between the parties qua the parking fee for the vehicles parked near the tea stall of the mother of the petitioner and the petitioner along with his accomplice attacked upon the complainant and the petitioner fired two gunshots.

Considering the criminal antecedents of the petitioner and the specific allegations against the petitioner, this Court does not find any ground to grant regular bail to the petitioner.

The present petition is dismissed.

However, it is observed that the weapon used in the crime has not been recovered by the investigations agency as yet and in the Challan filed by SI Talwinder Singh, Section 201 IPC has also not been added.

Let SI Talwinder Singh be present in the Court on 17.08.2022 along with his affidavit on this issue.
