The prayer in this petition under section 439 Cr.PC is for the grant of regular bail in case FIR No.77 dated 27.06.2022 under Sections 458, 323, 341, 506, 148, 149 IPC registered at Police Station Sadar Sangrur.

The FIR came to be registered at the instance of Gurveer Singh who stated that he was married and has a son aged 10 years. He had taken the land of Kesar Singh on lease. On 26.06.2022 when he went to his motor there Sikander Singh son of Mithu Singh, Jaggu Singh son of Bhola Singh along with 06 more persons were sitting and drinking alcohol. He told them that they should not be there and they stated that they would not come to the motor again after which he went home where at about 10.00 pm Sikander Singh and others started pelting stones and bricks into his house and

thereafter entered into the house. Sikander Singh and Jaggu Singh along with those persons caused injuries with a spade and iron *datar*. Other also caused injuries to the complainant side.

The Counsel for the petitioner at the very outset states that a compromise has been effected between the parties and an affidavit (Annexure P-2) in that regard has been furnished . Since the petitioner is in custody since 27.06.2022 and the compromise has been recorded, he prays for the grant of regular bail.

The factum of compromise has not been disputed by the counsel for the complainant who submits that in fact a quashing petition based on compromise is to be filed soon and therefore, does not oppose the grant of bail.

The Counsel for the State on the other hand contends that he is unaware of the factum of compromise.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties at length.

Keeping in view the aforementioned facts, but without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner-**Jaggu Singh @ Jagsir Singh** son of Sh. Bhola Singh is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned CJM/Duty Magistrate, concerned.

Petition stands disposed of.
