The petitioner has filed this petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing the impugned order dated 30.06.2022 (Annexure P-6) passed by respondent-Bank, whereby the petitioner has been transferred from Khanna Branch to Slahar Branch (wrongly typed as Siahar in head note of the petition); along with certain other prayers.

Undisputedly, the case of the petitioner is that he has remained posted at his place of posting for about nine years. The only submission by counsel for the petitioner is that the petitioner had opted for the transfer at Bathinda whereas the respondent-Bank has transferred him to Slahar Branch. The counsel has further submitted that keeping in view the condition contained in the policy, the request of the petitioner

should have been considered and he should have been adjusted at Bathinda.

However, this argument of the counsel for the petitioner cannot be entertained by the Court. Transfer is only an incidence of service. Otherwise; the employer is fully entitled to transfer the employee at the place better suitable for smooth running of administration. The petitioner has not even been successful in making out any special case for any specified personal reasons.

In view of the above, this court does not find any ground to interfere in the matter. Accordingly, the petition stands dismissed.
