[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiation of proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P-1, dated 19.07.2021, in CWP No.13103 of 2021 in case titled as '**Amarjit Kaur and others** versus **State of Haryana and others.**'

[2] A perusal of order (Annexure P-1), reveals that CWP No. 13103 of 2021, was disposed of by directing respondent No.1 to consider and decide the representation of the petitioners dated 26.03.2021 and take a conscious decision thereon by passing a speaking order within three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order and in case the petitioners were found entitled to any pecuniary benefits upon such a conscious decision, to release the pecuniary benefits to the petitioners within a further period of three months from the date of such conscious decision of the authorities.

[3] At the outset, learned Asstt. AG, Haryana, has produced

copy of speaking order dated 03.08.2022, partly accepting the claim of the petitioners. The same is taken on record. Copy thereof supplied to learned counsel for the petitioners, who on perusal thereof states that in the circumstances, the petitioners do not wish to pursue the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same with liberty to challenge order dated 03.08.2022 to the extent the same is adverse to the interest of the petitioners viz-a-viz the claim for leave encashment.

[4] In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioners, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, while granting liberty to the petitioners as prayed for.
