The present application has been filed for placing on record the replication to the written statement filed on behalf of respondent No.3.

Application is allowed and the said replication is taken on record.

CWP No.24513 of 2017

In the present petition, the prayer of the petitioners is that they are entitled for the grant of benefit of the recommendations of Chapter 26 of the Punjab 3rd Pay Commission Report, which has been made effective w.e.f. 01.01.1986. Learned counsel for the petitioners argues that the petitioners have not been given the benefit of the same.

After notice of motion, the respondents have filed a detailed reply, wherein it has been mentioned that the recommendations of Chapter 26 of the Punjab 3rd Pay Commission have already been implemented and the salary of the technicians have been fixed according to the same w.e.f. 01.04.1986 onwards. As per the reply, no further monetary benefit is to be extended to the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that keeping in view the reply given, the present petition may kindly be disposed of with liberty to the petitioners to approach the respondents, in case, any other grievance of the petitioners still subsists, by way of filing an appropriate representation.

Learned counsel for the respondents submits that in case the petitioners approach the respondents by filing a representation, the same will be decided in accordance with law by passing an appropriate speaking order, within a period of 8 weeks of receipt of the said representation.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that in view of the statement of learned counsel for the respondents, no further grievance of the petitioners survives in the present petition and the same may kindly be disposed of having been not pressed any further with liberty as prayed for.

Ordered accordingly.
