AMARJOT BHATTI J. (ORAL)

The petitioners-Jasjeet Singh and Jaspreet Singh have filed the instant petition under Section 482 of Cr.P.C. for quashing the FIR No.282 dated 01.06.2019, registered under Sections 323, 354, 377, 406, 498-A, 506, 511 of IPC at Police Station City Yamuna Nagar, District Yamuna Nagar on the basis of compromise between the parties.

As per the facts of the case, the complainant-Sandeep Kaur has filed a written complaint against the petitioners-Jasjeet Singh (husband) and Jaspreet Singh (brother-in-law) with the allegations of harassment. She stated that she got married with Jasjeet Singh on 23.01.2000. Her parents had spent Rs.40 lacs on her marriage. She was

given gold ornaments and dowry articles. Her parents had also provided financial help from time to time, as her father-in-law was sick. They also provided financial help for the construction of house and Rs.25 lacs for starting the business of plywood. Her parents again provided financial help of Rs.10 lacs, as loan was taken on her gold ornaments. Despite all this they were unhappy with the complainant and started misbehaving with her. She has levelled allegations against her brother-in-law by alleging that he was keeping bad eye on her. A joint divorce petition was also filed, but accused raised demand of Rs.35 lacs for giving divorce. She was beaten up and threatened in the matrimonial home. With these allegations present FIR has been registered.

The petitioners filed this petition for the quashing of aforesaid FIR on the basis of compromise. The petitioners and respondent No.2 were directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate for recording their statements on the basis of compromise. The detailed report regarding compromise has been received from the court of Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhri dated 23.09.2022. The statement of complainant-Sandeep Kaur has been recorded, where she confirmed the compromise with the petitioner. She confirmed that this compromise has been effected without any pressure, coercion from any side and she has no objection regarding quashing of FIR.

The petitioners-Jasjeet Singh and Jaspreet Singh also confirmed this fact in their separate statement. The statement of ASI Ved Pal is also recorded who further confirmed that the accused are not involved in any other case nor have been declared as proclaimed

offenders.

Therefore, from the report of Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhri, it is clear that the compromise has been effected between the parties without any pressure, coercion or undue influence, which is acceptable to both the parties. They have mutually settled all their disputes. Now they will be able to live peacefully and future litigation will also come to an end. Therefore, no purpose would be served with the continuation of criminal proceedings.

Therefore considering these facts the petition filed by the petitioners is accepted and the FIR No.282 dated 01.06.2019, registered under Sections 323, 354, 377, 406, 498-A, 506, 511 of IPC at Police Station City Yamuna Nagar, District Yamuna Nagar and the consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed.

Accordingly, the present petition stands disposed of.
