Prayer in the application is for placing on record the copy of petition filed by the complainant before the learned Civil Judge, (Sr. Divn.) Sangrur under the Adoption and Maintenance Act, 1956, and the receipt of Rs. 8 lakh, as Annexures P-8 and P-9.

Notice in the application.

Learned State counsel accepts notice and submits that the has no objection, if the application is allowed.

In view of the above, the application is allowed. Annexures P-8 and P-9 are taken on record.

Main case:

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in the present case; that complainant-Charanjit Kaur is real sister-in-law of the petitioner; that after separation from her husband, the

complainant was residing with the petitioner and his wife (real sister of the complainant); that the petitioner has given Rs. 15 lakh to the complainant, out of which the complainant returned some amount; and that when the petitioner asked for his remaining amount, the complainant lodged the present FIR against the petitioner.

Vide order dated 31.08.2022, *ad interim* anticipatory bail was granted to the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that pursuant to the aforesaid order dated 31.08.2022, the petitioner has joined the investigation and deposited Rs. 8 lakh with the Registry, by way of a demand draft, in the name of Registrar General of this Court.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Chamkaur Singh, submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for any further investigation.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the above, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 31.08.2022 granting *ad interim* anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made absolute, subject to the conditions envisaged in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
