Matter has been taken up through video conferencing via Webex facility in the light of the Pandemic Covid-19 situation and as per instructions.

Petitioner had approached this Court praying for grant of anticipatory bail to him in case FIR No.101 dated 1.6.2021 under sections 323, 34, 354-A, 377, 406, 498-A and 506 I.P.C, registered at Police Station, Sector 65, Gurugram, District Gurugram.

From the pleadings on record, it is apparent that the petitioner is residing in U.S.A, however, on 13.10.2021 it was argued before this Court that the petitioner has returned to India and he is keen to settle the dispute amicably. Taking into consideration the nature of the case and bonafide of the petitioner, this Court granted interim protection to the petitioner to the effect that no coercive action shall be taken against him.

Today it has been submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that litigation expenses of Rs.25,000/- have been paid by the petitioner, however, to the utter surprise it has been brought to the notice of

the Court that the petitioner has already left India without seeking any permission from this Court or the investigating agency. This fact has been disclosed by learned counsel for the petitioner as well as by counsel for the complainant. Petitioner has misused the concession of interim protection and has shown least regard to the judicial order passed by this Court.

Hence, by his conduct petitioner does not deserve any concession of anticipatory bail. Resultantly, the present petition is dismissed.
