AVNEESH JHINGAN , J.(Oral)

1. This second petition was filed seeking regular bail in case of FIR No. 56, dated 19th March, 2022, under Sections 420, 406 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Section 24 of Emigration Act, registered at Police Station Industrial Area, Phase-I, Chandigarh.

2. On 7th September, 2022 following order was passed:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner on instructions submits that the petitioner is ready to adhere to the terms of compromise and in order to show his bonafide will deposit 25% of the amount due i.e. Rs.20,00,000/-.

Let the parties appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court on 21st September, 2022.

Adjourned to 31st October, 2022.”

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner and the complainant are *ad idem* that twenty five per cent of Rs.20,00,000/- has been paid by the petitioner to the complainant.

3. The dispute was with regard to Rs.20,00,000/- ostensibly received by the petitioner on pretext of sending the complainant abroad.

4. Learned counsel for the parties on instruction submit that there is a chance of amicable settlement. The matter was earlier compromised though the period mentioned for returning the amount has expired. Submission is that matter be again sent to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre for settling the fresh terms of the compromise.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances in totality as also that the petitioner has deposited Rs.5,00,000/- to show his *bonafide* to settle the matter, he is granted bail, subject to his furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate/ Duty Magistrate concerned.

6. The petition is disposed of.

7. The parties however, will continue to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court on 1st December, 2022.
