[1] Prayer in the instant petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 01.05.2019 in CWP No.11319 of 2019.

[2] A perusal of order (Annexure P-1) reveals that CWP No.11319 of 2019 was disposed of by directing the respondent to decide representation dated 07.01.2019 for grant of monetary benefits in view of decision dated 22.08.2016 in CWP No.3424 of 1994 in case titled as 'Ram Kanwar and others versus State of Haryana and others' within 06 months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

[3] Learned counsel states that pursuant to issuance of notice to the respondent, the respondent has decided the claim of the petitioners as contained in representation dated 07.01.2019 and released part of the benefits claimed, to the petitioners, therefore, the petitioners are not interested in pursuing the contempt petition and may be permitted to

withdraw the same with liberty to challenge by way of appropriate proceedings in accordance with law, decision dated 04.10.2019, whereby part of the claim for monetary benefits has been rejected.

[4] In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioners, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, while granting liberty to the petitioners as prayed for.
