1. Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order Annexure P-1, dated 06.12.2021 in CRM-M-40980-2021.

2. A perusal of order Annexure P-1, dated 06.12.2021, reveals that CRM-M-40980-2021, was disposed of in view of statement of learned APP, U.T. Chandigarh that suicide note was sent to the CFSL on 22.09.2021 and that action in accordance with law would be taken expeditiously as soon as the report was received,.

3. Learned Senior Standing Counsel, U.T. on instructions from Inspector Jasbir Singh, SHO, Police Station Sector 11, Chandigarh states that pursuant to receipt of CFSL report, FIR No.122 dated 10.09.2022 under Section 306 IPC has been registered and investigation in the same

4. The same satisfies learned counsel for the petitioner, who states that in the circumstances, she does not press the instant petition and the same may be disposed of as such while directing respondent No.2 to adhere to the assurance held out by him through the learned Senior Standing counsel.

5. In view of the position noted above, as well as assurance of respondent No.2 through the learned Senior Standing Counsel, the instant petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 while directing respondent No.2 to take steps to conclude investigation in the matter expeditiously in accordance with law.
