The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for directing respondent Nos.1 to 3 to take appropriate legal action against the respondent No.6 to 8 for causing serious injuries on the face of the petitioner and thereby removing the teeth of the petitioner with the aid of baseball bat and further for taking action against the respondent Nos.6 to 8 on the basis of the reports submitted by Doctor Sh. Sukhdev Singh, Medical Officer, Civil Hospital, Amritsar.

Notice in this cases has been issued to respondent No.1 to 5 on 12.01.2021. Pursuant thereto reply by way of affidavit dated 12.03.2021 of Mr. Abhimanyu Rana, IPS, Assistant Superintendent of Police, Sub-Division Majitha, Amritsar Rural, on behalf of respondent Nos.1 to 3, has been filed and taken on record, copy of which has been supplied to the learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned State counsel makes a reference to para-4 of the reply,
which reads as under:-

“4. That it is humbly submitted that the final report bearing No. 157, dated 13.10.2020 of the Emergency Medical Officer, CHC Manawal with respect to nature of injuries of the petitioner along with MLR, report of board of doctors, X-ray films, dental opinion and one forwarding letter was received at Police Station Jandiala, Amritsar-Rural and statement in this regard of the petitioner Rulda Singh was recorded on 17/10/2020 by ASI Baljit Singh of PS Jandiala, Amritsar Rural. According to the statement of the petitioner and as per final opinion given by the Emergency Medical Officer, CHC Manawala, Amritsar, wherein all the five injuries of the petitioner were declared simple in nature, the non-cognizable offence under Section 323 IPC was found to be made out. Therefore, GD No. 29, dated 17.10.2020 (Annexure P-4) was recorded in this regard and the petitioner was advised to pursue his matter before the Ld. Court. The true typed copy of board of doctors and final report of the doctor are annexed herewith as Annexure R-1 and R-2 for the kind perusal of this Hon'ble Court.”

In view of the aforesaid, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the present petition has been rendered infructuous and may be disposed of as such.

In view of the above, no further order is required, disposed of as such.
