1. On query, learned counsel for the petitioners fairly concedes that as on date, further appointment to the post of Surveyor have not been made but the respondents have conducted counselling and are in the process of issuing merit list and appointment letters.

2. In view of the aforementioned position, learned counsel for the petitioners states that he does not press the instant petition at this stage and may be permitted to withdraw the same with liberty to serve a legal notice on the respondents apprising them of the restraint order Annexure P-1 dated 23.03.2017 in CWP-5770-2017 and to file a fresh petition if the circumstances of the case, so warrant.

3. In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioners, the instant petition is disposed of at this stage as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 while granting liberty to the petitioners as prayed for.
