Affidavit is filed by learned State counsel in the Court today and the same is taken on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that keeping in view the said affidavit filed on behalf of the respondents today, most of the benefits, which are being sought for in the present petition, have already been extended in favour of the petitioner. Learned counsel further submits that though the release of the pensionary benefits is consideration of the Government, but the respondents may kindly be directed to conclude the said consideration and grant the pensionary benefits, in respect of the services rendered by the late husband of the petitioner, to her in a time bound manner, so that she does not suffer any further prejudice.

Learned State counsel submits that all the efforts will be made

to release the said pensionary benefits in favour of the petitioner within a period of two months from the date of receipt of the copy of this order.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that order dated 17.05.2022, passed by the authorities concerned, as mentioned in the affidavit filed by learned State counsel today, is silent with regard to the grant of back wages and interest on the delayed release of pensionary benefits to the petitioner, in respect of the services rendered by her late husband, hence she be given liberty to approach the respondents by filing an appropriate representation, raising the said grievance.

Learned State counsel submits that in case any such representation is filed by the petitioner, the same will be considered in accordance with law and an appropriate speaking order will be passed by the authorities concerned within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of such representation, after the petitioner completes the formalities qua the same.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that keeping in view the submissions of learned State counsel, as recorded hereinbefore, no further grievance of the petitioner survives in the present petitioner at this stage and the same may kindly be disposed of as having been not pressed any further at this stage with the liberty as prayed for.
