Case is taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Through this petition, the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.0679 dated 20.10.2018 registered under Sections 302, 34, 404 IPC at Police Station Samalkha, District Panipat.

Status report by way of affidavit dated 29.01.2022 of the Deputy Superintendent of Police, Samalkha, District Panipat, already filed in the Registry, is taken on record.

Vide order dated 03.11.2021 passed by this Court, the petitioner was directed to appear before the learned trial Court.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that pursuant to the aforesaid order dated 03.11.2021, the petitioner appeared before the learned trial Court on 18.11.2021 and whereupon he was admitted to *ad interim* anticipatory bail on his furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs. 1,00,000/- with one surety in the like amount.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

The petitioner has already appeared before the learned trial Court on 18.11.2021 and released on ad interim anticipatory bail.

In view of the above, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 03.11.2021 granting *ad interim* anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
