1. Prayer in the instant petition is for initiating action against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 07.10.2021, in CWP-20426-2021, in case titled as 'Madhur Malik vs. HPSC'.

2. A perusal of order Annexure P/1, dated 07.10.2021, reveals that CWP-20426-2021, was disposed of by directing the competent authority to look into the grievance of the petitioner by keeping in view the contentions raised in the writ petition and by treating the same as representation and take a decision in respect thereto, in accordance with law, within three months from the date of order.

3. Learned DAG, Haryana, has placed on record copy of order dated 06.04.2022, extending the time for deciding the representation of the petitioner, as expeditiously as possible but not later than two weeks prior to the declaration of schedule of written examination to be

conducted pursuant to advertisement dated 26.02.2021.

4. Learned counsel for the respondent further states that HCS (Executive Branch) and other Allied Services Preliminary Examination held on 12.09.2021, has been cancelled and examination for the aforementioned post will now be held on 10.07.2022 and only those candidates who had earlier applied in response to advertisement No.03/2021, dated 26.02.2021 and were found eligible, would be entitled to appear in the examination to be held on 10.07.2022. The same satisfies learned counsel for the petitioner, who states that in the circumstances, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

5. In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the parties, the instant petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
