HARSIMRAN SINGH SETHI J. (ORAL)

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners had submitted the applications in pursuance to order dated 21.01.2020 (Annexure P-2), passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, but their applications for the grant of bus permits to them, though accepted, but were not notarized as received by the respondent-Department, hence, have not been considered and decided by the authorities concerned, which action of the respondent-Department is causing prejudice to the petitioners.

Learned State counsel submits that last date for submitting the application under the order dated 21.01.2020, passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, was 27.01.2020, whereas the petitioners submitted their applications in July, 2020, which could not have been considered in any manner by the respondent-Department, and therefore, the grievance which is being raised by the petitioners in the present petition is liable to be rejected.

The disputed question of facts being raised in the present petition that as to whether the petitioners submitted their applications for consideration of the grant of bus permits to them within the time frame, keeping in view the order dated 21.01.2020, passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, or not, this Court is not in a position to decide the said disputed question of facts.

Faced with this situation, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that once the petitioner have submitted their applications, it becomes duty of the respondent-Department to pass the appropriate orders on the said applications, either accepting or rejecting the same by giving appropriate reasons.

Learned State counsel submits that the appropriate orders on the said applications, as filed by the petitioners for the grant of bus permits to them, will be passed by the competent authority within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of the copy of this order, if not already done, and the orders so passed, will be conveyed to the petitioners immediately thereafter, for their information and necessary action.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that keeping in view the submissions of learned State counsel, as recorded hereinbefore, no further grievance of the petitioners survives in the present petition at this stage and the same may kindly be disposed of as having been not pressed any further at this stage.

Ordered accordingly.
