[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiating action against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order (Annexure P-1) dated 22.02.2019 in CWP No.3450 of 2016 in case titled as Zora Singh vs. State of Punjab and Ors.

[2] A perusal of order (Annexure P-1) reveals that CWP No.3450 of 2016 was disposed of by directing an appropriate order to be passed granting benefit to the beneficiaries by the competent authority in view of the settlement arrived at between the parties before the Mediation Centre within one month from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

[3] Notice has yet not been issued in the instant case. On 06.09.2019, learned State counsel had sought time to seek instructions. Today, learned AAG refers to the status report by way of affidavit of Sh. Bikramjit Singh, PPS, AIG/Admn., Technical Services Wing, Punjab Chandigarh filed on behalf of respondent No.3 on 18.04.2022, releasing the financial benefits to the petitioner as per his entitlement in terms of the

settlement arrived at between the parties before the Mediation Centre.

[4] Learned counsel for the petitioner states that in view of financial benefits having been released to the petitioner as per his entitlement, the petitioner does not press the instant petition.

[5] In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
