After arguing for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner states that he does not press the instant petition but prays for grant of liberty to the petitioner to avail appropriate remedy before the Child Welfare Committee, Amritsar/Competent Forum/Court, for shifting of his daughter from Bhawan Ashray to her grandmother's care and custody.

2. In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is dismissed as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
