The matter has been taken up through Video Conferencing.

The petitioner had earlier approached this Court for the same relief as claimed in the present petition i.e. for the grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.89 dated 07.07.2021 registered under Sections 22 & 29 of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 at Police Station Bareta, District Mansa which petition of his being CRM-M-43231-2021 – Subhash Chander vs. State of Punjab was dismissed on 25.10.2021 through the following order:-

“The arguments raised on behalf of the petitioner having not received a favourable response from the Bench and not to invite a decision on merits lest it may prejudice the case of the petitioner at a later stage, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks to withdraw the present petition.

Permitted to do so.

Dismissed as withdrawn.”

The only ground to again approach this Court for the relief which was earlier denied to the petitioner is that co-accused – Ajay from whom the alleged recovery of psychotropic substances had been made has been granted bail by the Trial Court.

A perusal of the record reveals that co-accused – Ajay has been granted regular bail by the Trial Court and not anticipatory bail which is sought by the petitioner.

That being so no ground for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made out.

Dismissed.
