1. Prayer in the instant petition is for initiation of proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order Annexure P-1, dated 09.05.2022, in CWP-22829-2021 .

2. A perusal of order Annexure P-1 reveals that CWP-22829-2021 and other connected cases, were allowed, order dated 17.09.2021 as was impugned as Annexure P/8 in the aforementioned writ petition was set aside while granting liberty to the respondent to pass appropriate orders of punishment as per rules after giving opportunity of hearing to the petitioner.

3. Pursuant to time taken by the learned State counsel to obtain instructions and to assist in the matter, order dated 07.12.2022, has been produced. The same is taken on record. Copy thereof supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner, who on perusal of the same, states that in view of order Annexure R/1 dated 07.12.2022, exonerating the petitioner and restoring the benefit of stoppage of two increments with cumulative effect with all pensionary benefits, he does not press the instant petition but prays for grant of liberty to the petitioner to take out appropriate proceedings, in

accordance with law to seek interest on the payments wrongly withheld.

4. In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, while granting liberty to the petitioner as prayed for.
