On 21.10.2022, the following order was passed:-

“Present petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case bearing FIR No.460, dated 16.08.2022, registered for offence punishable under Sections 406, 420, 468, 471 and 120-B of the IPC, at Police Station Gurugram Sadar, District Gurugram.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that in order to settle the matter, petitioner is ready to pay an amount of Rs.3.50 lakhs during the course of the day and rest of the amount shall be paid within a week thereafter. Mr. Jaidka appears for the complainant and is not averse to such settlement.

Keeping in view of the aforesaid statement made by counsel for the petitioner, the petitioner is ordered to be released on interim bail, subject to payment of Rs.3.5 lakhs during the course of the day. Mr. Jaidka shall provide account details of the complainant.

On his doing so, the petitioner shall be granted interim bail to the satisfaction of the Ld. Trial Court/Duty Magistrate, concerned.

Adjourned to 24.11.2022.”

2. Counsels are *ad idem* that the petitioner has paid an amount of Rs.4.38 lakhs to the complainant.
3. Counsel for the petitioner further submits that the investigation is complete and report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. already stands filed before the trial Court, thus there is no apprehension that the petition would tamper with the evidence.
4. Counsel for the State does not dispute the aforesaid factual assertions made on the basis of record.
5. In view of the above, the interim order dated 21.10.2022 passed by this Court is made absolute.
6. Petition stands disposed off.
