[1] Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to Covid-19 pandemic.

[2] After arguing for some time, learned counsel frankly concedes that there is no order in favour of the petitioners for which action under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is sought for against the respondent and that in the circumstances, he may be permitted to withdraw the instant petition with liberty to take out appropriate proceedings in accordance with law for redressal of the grievances of the petitioners.

[3] In view of the position noted above as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioners, no action under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is called for against the respondent.

[4] Accordingly, the Contempt petition is disposed of as such while granting liberty to the petitioners to take out appropriate proceedings in accordance with law for redressal of their grievances as

are the subject matter of the instant petition.
